Spring Instructional Season Tee Ball Rules and Regulations

Objective

The goal is to encourage participation and good sportsmanship. The focus will be on safety, fun and instruction. There will be no umpires on the field and no scores kept.

Format

Tee Ball uses 4 fields: Scala , Dupont, Perrault and Barnabe. Maps are available on the OLLB website at www.oreanslittleleague.ca

The season runs for 8 weeks from late April/early May to mid-June and teams will play twice per week for a total of 16 games. Rain-outs will not be rescheduled (4 extra games were built into the schedule to cover this).

Players are expected to be at the field dressed and ready for practice at 5:45 p.m.

Mandatory practice drills will be held from 5:45-6:30 p.m. These must be completed by both teams before a game can begin.

Games will be held from 6:30-7:30 p.m. No new inning can start after 7:30 p.m.

Role of the Parents

A responsible adult must accompany each player and remain at the park for the duration of the practice/game. No child should ever be left alone.

No parents are allowed on the field or in the dugout unless they have submitted a valid police record check and volunteer form.

Parents are asked to inform team managers if their child will be unable to attend a practice/game.

Parents are encouraged to praise and cheer on the players of both teams. Please DO NOT coach the players from the bleachers – this will interfere with the work of the coaches and only confuse the kids.

Dress Code and Equipment

All players, managers and coaches must wear the supplied t-shirt and hat, as well as long pants (no shorts) and running shoes/cleats (no sandals). Players wearing shorts and/or sandals will not be allowed on the field. No jewelry should be worn on the field or in the dugout (with the exception of Medic Alert bracelets or necklaces).

Players should also wear a jock/jill and bring their own glove, helmet and water bottle.

A bat, tee and balls are provided at each field; therefore, it is unnecessary for players to bring their own.

Please dress according to the weather. A long-sleeve shirt or jacket to wear under the t-shirt provided might be a good idea, particularly in early May. It could be 20°C at 5:00 p.m. but the temperature may drop quickly after 6:00 p.m.

Rain-out and Lightning Policy

When the weather is questionable, team managers will contact each other in advance to confirm or cancel a practice/game. Contact should be initiated after 4:00 p.m. and a decision made by 5:00 p.m., in order to leave time to inform the parents. Parents should not expect a call/email before this time. If you do not hear from your team manager, assume that the practice/game is still on and proceed to the park as usual. Usually only a very heavy rain or a steady rain for days will make conditions poor enough to cancel.

All practices/games must be cancelled or called in the event of a thunderstorm with lightning. At the first sign of lightning by a player, parent, coach or manager, everyone is to immediately leave the field for shelter.

Rules of Play

This is an instructional, non-competitive league. No individual or team statistics will be kept. We have a longstanding record for ties in Tee Ball...everyone is a winner! Emphasis should always be on fun and learning the basics of the game. The kids will have plenty of time for competition as they get older.

For safety reasons, players MUST wear batting helmets throughout the game. At this age, players can be inattentive.

Every player bats in an inning – there is no sitting. Please mix up the batting order every inning or at least every game. If only 4 or less players show up on one team, talk to the other manager and consider either allowing players to hit twice or borrowing players from the other team.

Rules of Play (continued)

Coaches can help batters get ready in the on-deck circle at a safe distance from the batter.

Everyone plays defence in an inning. Managers should ensure that everyone has a chance to play at every position. SAFETY TIP: Keep defensive players off the base paths to avoid collisions with the runners.

There are no outs in Tee Ball. Keep runners on base, advancing 1 base at a time until they reach home plate. All runners keep advancing to home on the final at-bat of an inning. Last batter in an inning should always be announced. Games typically last 3-4 innings.

Coaches should assist defensive players when a strong hitter is at bat, particularly in the traditional pitching mound area of the infield.

All players and coaches must shake hands after the game.
